## **ACADEMICS**

We are grateful to have reached the end of the first term without any disruptions due to the pandemic. Learners were able to attend school daily and we managed to cover the complete Annual Teaching Plans for Term 1.

## PARENT SUPPORT

We are grateful to those parents who supported their children with homework and preparation for assessments. Those learners who worked hard and reaped the fruits of their labour, have done us proud.

However, we are concerned about a large number of children who have not pulled their weight this term. The percentage of learners who did not complete their homework and/or hand in assessments or tasks, is concerning. In some instances, tasks were completed without the necessary research or finishing touches. Incomplete homework is a problem that teachers are confronted with daily. We urgently request that parents familiarise themselves with the assessment programmes and ensure that learners are well prepared in future.



# GENERAL PROBLEM AREAS

Three problem areas have been identified from Grade 1-7.
