## RUGBY

Our boys had their first rugby season of the year and made their way through seven games for the season against our neighbouring schools such as Bastion, Kenridge, Durbanville and Panorama and some schools outside our normal opponents like Van Riebeeckstrand, Table View and Worcester Primary.

We are proud of all our boys who have competed and represented our school and the Fern with pride and honor. For some it has been a tough season and we only started having the results we wanted at the end of the season.

Our u/7 players show a promising group for the future with all our teams, A-F teams, playing a total of 29 games and winning 23 of those games, scoring 615 points and only conceding 315.

Our u/8A also showcased great rugby this term and only lost one of their six games and by one try. This team scored 28 tries and only had 3 tries scored against them.

The seniors of our mini-rugby teams, u/9A, also did not disappoint. They played six games and only lost one. They scored 32 tries and only had 7 tries scored against them.

As usual our senior teams showed up in full force for their matches. A total of 50 games was played between our u/10-u/13 teams. We are very blessed with five u/13 teams this year and a large number of players will lead to good results. One team in particular showed great efforts with their season thus far and its is none other than our u/13C team. The u/13C team played seven games and won five of their games scoring 173 points and conceding 53.

- Round 4: Western Cape – The Top 3 best schools from the Boland, WP and SWD compete against each other.

Our u/12A team placed 1<sup>st</sup> in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> round of the competition beating Bastion, De Kuilen, Lochnerhof and De Hoop but unfortunately missed out on the 4<sup>th</sup> and final round. We are still very proud of them.

Each week our chess teams showed what they are capable of and we cannot wait to see how many players will represent Western Province in the future.




## FOUNDATION PHASE SPORTS DAY
